

Complex, interrelated factors contribute to an increased suicide risk among AI/AN people and include mental health disorders, substance abuse, intergenerational trauma, and community-wide issues. Factors that protect AI/AN youth and young adults against suicidal behavior are a sense of belonging to one's culture, a strong tribal/spiritual bond, the opportunity to discuss problems with family or friends, feeling connected to family, and positive emotional health.

Early Childhood Mental Health Specialists

(State General Funds and Child Care Development Funds)

Involves building the knowledge and skills of the early care and learning providers, supporting best practices for social and emotional development, and the importance of timely childhood mental health support, especially for those children at higher risk because of behavioral difficulties and disabilities. Focuses on prevention and early identification of concerns or problems that could lead to greater challenges, and can provide support when a child is at risk of expulsion or disenrollment from a child care program.


